What remote education will be made available for different learner cohorts (14 to 16, 16 to 19, apprentices, adult learners)?

Each student has been provided with an online timetable, which they must follow. Timetables will vary depending on which department students are in and if you attend maths and English GCSE classes.

Delivery arrangements, such as timetabling, virtual learning environments and assessment arrangements

Expectations of students

All students are expected to access their timetabled online lessons and tutorials. Daily registers are kept and recorded, any students who are not in attendance will be contacted and staff will request a reason for their absence.

Arrangements for students studying courses that require specialist equipment or facilities

Any students who require specialist equipment will have been contacted by their course tutors or a member from the curriculum area. If you have not been contacted and require specialist equipment please contact your course tutor and head of departments as soon as possible.
